I received your letter last night. I am very much obliged to you for I certainly do not underrate the importance of it. In the first place I must thank you for taking so much account of what I said, and I am glad that you have given me the opportunity of clearing up a misunderstanding.

My dear Noel.

Many thanks for your letter and enclosure which I have read with much interest and will show to David, when he comes this week. We have not met since the war began (except for an hour at David's wedding), and I am not in recent touch with him on the question you raise, but I feel sure he will be interested in your paper.

I gather your views as to the present position are that there should be a Conference on prospective Peace conditions on roughly the following lines.

That we should offer Germany the same system of Preferential Trading as is now existing between the British and French Empires.

Not to do this, we should place our Colonies under some form of Mandatory Regime, which we should do at once.

Query: what form of Mandatory Regime would you suggest, and who would be the Mandatory Consortium proposed. Would the Colonies have any voice in the ? matter of their concerns?

Engastalome. Would the Mandatory Powers be only England and France and ollowed 7 deventually Germany, or would they include Italy and Russia and, Col Mate if so, would the other powers also bring their Colonies under

the same Mandatory Condominium? or would each Colony have a Mandate for its own Colonies, subject to a general rules of Administration?

How would the Disarmament guarantee be assured?

The publication of the Nazi claim to eventual domination of ka shake the Europe and indeed of the larger part of the globe, based on the decay of the virility of the Dominions, has been not shallow only publicly made, but the whole youth of the country has been educated and completely saturated with the belief in their mission; it will be difficult to destroy this belief, and the other Nazi one, that for the nation's success, all is permissible and no oath need stand.

I am not sure from the Paper, whether it is suggested that the negotiations should be carried on with Hitler and the Nazi Government, as this point is not mentioned, but I imagine not, as negotiations opened with them or concessions offered them before a decided blow to them, would certainly be looked upon by them and by the world, as a victory for their policy of aggression after their attitude and action about past guarantees.

Here are a few of the points that rise in my mind on first reading the paper and which I do not feel quite clear about and so inflict these questions on you!

The whole ground is so vitiated by the happenings of the last 2 years.

What seemed clear before, seems completely dark now. The

horrors of Poland and Finland (apart from what has happened before) which seem to arouse no shame or revolt among the German people, seem to put a query as to whether as a nation they are prepared to accept Hitler's Gospel with all that this entails.

It is a dreadful thought if this is so. I had always hoped that if generous gestures were made, the larger body of the Public would have responded; but these last records of German activities, done since all possibility of any feeling of "underdog" can exist, and the destruction of any carrying out of their own original doctrines of the protection of minorities, or the rights of free peoples, make the hopes that one had cherished seem like phantoms, in the face of what has happened - to make the future dark indeed.
